

ORDINANCE NO. 138, 2002

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF TILDEN, BERKS COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA APPOINTING THE ELECTED TAX COLLECTOR AS A DELINQUENT TAX COLLECTOR IN ACCORDANCE WITH 72 P.S. §5511.26a (ACT 104 of 2000) AND PROVIDING FOR THE COLLECTION OF DELINQUENT TAXES IN ACCORDANCE WITH AND PROVIDING THE SAME POWERS, RIGHTS, PRIVILEGES, DUTIES AND OBLIGATIONS AS ARE SET FORTH IN SECTION 686 OF THE ACT OF MARCH 10, 1949 (P.L. 30, No. 14) KNOWN AS THE "PUBLIC SCHOOL CODE OF 1949"**

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors desire to appoint the elected tax collector as a delinquent tax collector in accordance with 72 P.S. §5511.26a (Act 104 of 2000) and desire to provide for the collection of delinquent taxes and to provide the same powers, rights, privileges, duties and obligations as are set forth in Section 686 of the Act of March 10, 1949 (P.L. 30, No. 14) known as the Public School Code of 1949.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Tilden, Berks County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the authority of the same as follows:

Section 1. The elected tax collector of Tilden Township shall be appointed as a delinquent tax collector to provide for the collection of delinquent taxes in accordance with 72 P.S. §5511.26a (Act 104 of 2000) and is hereby provided the same powers, rights, privileges, duties and obligations as are set forth in Section 686 of the Act of March 10, 1949 (P.L. 30, No. 14) known as the "Public School Code of 1949".

Section 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances which are inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed insofar as they are inconsistent with this Ordinance.

Section 3. If any provision, sentence, clause, section or part of this Ordinance is for any reason found to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, such unconstitutionality, illegality or invalidity shall not affect or impair any of the remaining provisions, sentences, clauses, sections or parts of this Ordinance. It is hereby declared as the intent of the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Tilden that this Ordinance would have been adopted had such unconstitutional, illegal or invalid provision, sentence, clause, section or part thereof not been included herein.

Section 4. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective five (5) days after its enactment.


