

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF TILDEN, BERKS COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, AMENDING A PREVIOUS ORDINANCE NO. 36, WHEREIN PROVIDES THAT NO PUBLIC STREETS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF TILDEN BE OPENED OR CUT BY ANY PERSON; FIRM, CORPORATION OR UTILITY WITHOUT FIRST SECURING A PERMIT IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE TOWNSHIP CODE, AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

The Board of Supervisors of the Township of Tilden hereby amends Ordinance No. 36, enacted and ordained as an Ordinance on June 4, 1974, as follows:

SECTION 1 - Section 6 of the aforesaid Ordinance is hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION 2 - Any person, firm, corporation or utility which shall violate any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be subject upon conviction before a District Justice, to pay a fine of not more than Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) and cost of prosecution, and in default of the payment of such fine and costs to imprisonment in the County jail for not more than five (5) days.

SECTION 3 - In all other respects the Ordinance originally adopted remains in full force and effect.
